Meet Bestselling Author Alka Joshi on November 4

Alka Joshi, author of the novels *The Henna Artist* and *The Secret Keeper of Jaipur*, will talk about her books and her writing career in a Friends Zoom presentation on November 4 at 11 a.m.

*The Henna Artis*t, the first novel in a trilogy, tells the story of Lakshmi who at age 17 runs away from an arranged, abusive marriage, leaving her 1950s rural village to make her own way in the city of Jaipur. She becomes a much-in-demand henna artist and confidante to upper-caste women, as she shapes her destiny in post-colonial India. Alka says, "I'm passionate about women's agency in life, especially in patriarchal cultures. It's important that I could imbue my writing with so many things I believe in."

Born in India, Alka came to the U.S. at age 9. After earning an undergraduate degree at Stanford, she worked for 30 years in marketing. Her husband, author Bradley Jay Owens, urged her to try writing fiction, pointing out that the ads and commercials she was crafting were really tiny stories. Encouragement from her instructors in

evening writing classes led her to spend two years pursuing an MFA at California College of the Arts. *The Henna Artist* was her master's thesis.


Upon publication, this debut novel quickly became a *New York Times* bestseller and a Reese Witherspoon Book Club pick, and is being translated into 23 languages. It is being developed as a limited television miniseries for Netflix.

While it took 10 years of research and many trips to India to develop her master's project into her first publishable book, Alka's second novel, *The Secret Keeper of Jaipur*, was released just 15 months after the first. "I had to cut 150 pages from my first manuscript," she explains, "so I had a lot of information

about the characters and their futures, making it easier to write subsequent books."

At the time of this interview, Alka was preparing to leave her home in Monterey to travel to France and Spain where she will research perfume-making for the final book of her trilogy.

In the year and a half since *The Henna Artist* was published, Alka has made Zoom presentations to people all over the world, including members of 570 book clubs. Estimating that she's talked to 6,000 people, Alka says, "It's a lot



of work to promote a book, but COVID and Zoom made it a bit easier." We're glad that Zoom makes it possible for her to speak to the Friends! **W**

If there's a tech problem or question in the library, Francisco Vargas is your go-to guy! As Los Gatos Library's technology specialist, he takes care of the website, the catalog, computers for staff and patrons and all the new technology such as 3D printers, laser-cutters and virtual reality. He also does graphic design for the library and has been very helpful to the Friends by creating posters and other materials and posting pictures of special items on Facebook.

The Friends sorting-room volunteers also appreciate that Francisco often restocks the book-sale shelves just inside the library's front door and sometimes helps with collecting book donations at the back door. When book donation was by appointment only, he used the library's reservation software for that end.

Francisco says, "The best part of my job is helping people with technology. Sometimes it's as easy as getting them their first audiobook on their smartphone or helping them finish a computer project. I bounce around the library all day long meeting new people and helping wherever I can."

Formerly a librarian in San Mateo County and at Long Beach Public Library, Francisco graduated in 2005 from library



school at the University of Arizona though a program called Knowledge River which at the time was only for Native Americans and Latinos. He has been at our library for just over a year, and loves living in Los Gatos. On his days off, he enjoys riding his bike, running the trails and being in nature.

The Only Bookstore in Town!



bookstore in town, and it offers thousands of books, many of which are like new and cost only \$1.

You can make purchases here whenever the library is open. Often, there is a themed selection of special books displayed in this "lobby shop."


Donations
