# **Discover LOST Gatos with Alan Feinberg**

I f you love Los Gatos, you'll love this talk by longtime resident and regular *Los Gatan* contributor Alan Feinberg! On Wednesday, May 3, he'll be speaking upstairs in the library starting at 5 p.m.

Alan is the developer of the free mobile app "Discover LOST Gatos" which offers three different self-guided walking tours of our historic downtown, highlighting the fascinating—but mostly

forgotten—people, places and events that have shaped Los Gatos over the past 200 years.

An electrical engineer with a master's degree in business, Alan relocated here 33 years ago from Concord, Massachusetts, to work in the semiconductor software industry. He and his wife, Joan, fell in love with Los Gatos, especially its downtown, which is on the National Register of Historic Places. (His favorite landmark is the Queen Anne Victorian house at 115 N. Santa Cruz Ave. which has served many purposes over the years and is currently The Palms Restaurant.)

After retiring and spending more time downtown, he became even more interested in the history of his adopted hometown and saw a need for a guide to its iconic buildings and the stories behind them, something similar to Boston's self-guided "Freedom Trail" walk. Not only would this benefit tourists, but it would also give residents a new look at their town. "We need to build interest in our heritage before it's lost or bulldozed. We need to treasure what's left," Alan says.

Instead of just a paper map and list of historic sites, Alan decided to develop a walking tour that offers an immersive Los Gatos history experience. So, in 2015, investing his own money and teaching himself how to build a mobile app, he teamed up with former library director and author Peggy Conaway Bergtold, who wrote the historical content, and former mayor Sandy Decker to launch the app. "It was a year-long labor of love and a gift to the community," he says.

The aim of the mobile app, which is available at the Apple App Store or Google Play, is to raise awareness among residents of the value of our historic treasures and to enrich the visitor experience. The same might be said of Alan's talk, which will be suitable for all ages and promises to be both educational and entertaining. **W**

# **President's Letter**

Dear Friends,

When I moved to Los Gatos nearly 50 years ago, one of the first things I did was to get a library card.

Gatos) and the Friends of the Library Bookstore. My family and I loved that library! The children's room was a cozy haven, and downstairs, historic photographs of the town hung on the walls surrounding the stacks and reference section.

But as the town's population increased, Los Gatos outgrew its library. During the early 2000s when high school let out, every space in the old library seemed to be occupied by teens, many sitting on the floor for lack of chairs. Downstairs, every wall was lined with unsightly boxes of donated books because the Friends of the Library had nowhere else to store them between quarterly book sales.

In 2009, the Friends launched a capital campaign which eventually raised more than \$2 million for furnishings and fixtures in a new library, the one we enjoy now. But the Friends didn't stop there! The organization opened a bookstore (located in what was once the children's library) to provide a steady income stream to support programs and special purchases for the library, a mission that continues today.

As much as I appreciated our library's former self, I can't help contrasting it with the current modern building and the profusion of services the library now provides to the community with the assistance of the Friends. One example close to my heart (because my kids were storytime regulars) is that storytime attendees no longer have to crowd around the presenter to see the pictures. Everyone has a perfect view of the illustrations because they're projected on a screen in the spacious children's room. And afterward, the youngsters get to play with age-appropriate toys, purchased with funds from the Friends. Storytimes are so popular, there are sometimes stroller traffic jams!

Though it's now 11 years old, ours is still a new library in many respects because it's always re-creating and updating itself. There are new categories of items to check out (turntables, sewing machines, and science kits, for example), new interest groups and new book clubs. With money raised through memberships, donations, and sales in the bookstore and on Amazon, the Friends of Los Gatos Library is dedicated to helping our library's amazing staff by funding performers, programs, local history, Storywalks, the Summer Reading Program, craft supplies, book club kits and more.

# Goodbye to Good Friends

Two hardworking, longtime members of the Friends of the Library board are retiring from the board this year.

It's no wonder that the Friends nominated her as a Senior of Distinction in 2017! **Cheryl McKenzie** has been on the board since 2008, serving on the steering committee of the capital campaign, as hospitality chair and, for many years, as publicity chair and website guru. Cheryl is the award-winning author (under the penname C. Lee McKenzie) of 10 published books for young adults, a second career she took up after retiring from San Jose State. Pre-COVID, she was the popular leader of five annual Young Writers Workshops, which are much-in-demand children's classes sponsored by the Friends.
