Laleh Khoshkbariie — Chef, Cookbook Author, Actress & Zumba Instructor — to Speak on May 1

Chef, cookbook author, actress and popular local Zumba teacher Laleh Khoshkbariie is the featured speaker at the Friends annual meeting on Wednesday, May 1, at 5 p.m. She'll share some of her inspiring life story and how she came to write her books.

A food enthusiast from her earliest years, Laleh grew up in a family of excellent cooks in Northern Iran which is famous for its cuisine. At age 2 she was helping her mother in the kitchen, and by the time she was 13 she was cooking solo for gatherings of 30 or 40 people.

Her family left Iran during the revolution when Laleh was age 5, and ended up in San Jose ("where I belong," she says) after going through Turkey, Italy, Switzerland and Canada.

She earned a degree in marketing from San Jose State University and also studied acting at Foothill College, performing in musical theater productions until she had children, a son, now 20, and a daughter, age 14.


Always athletic, she's played many different sports, and especially loves aerobics, working out, and all kinds of dance When she experienced Zumba for the first time, she was hooked, and immediately got certified to teach it. Laleh's classes at fitness clubs around Silicon Valley, such as the Bay Club Courtside in Los



Gatos and Forma Gym, are so popular that participants must reserve a spot in advance.

But food has always been a primary passion and has gotten her through some tough times. "When I had severe post-partum depression," she says, "what saved me was watching the Food Network."


After years of taking cooking classes, Laleh created and ran her own catering firm, Tulip Lolly Catering. But 12 years after setting up the business, she closed it during the COVID pandemic, and said to herself, "Let's see what life is trying to tell me." That's when she turned her attention to writing.



Her first book, Laleh's Table: Perfectly Prepared Persian Pleasures from Laleh's Table to Yours, took only one year to write since she had already perfected the recipes. For its gorgeous illustrations, she prepared the food,

staged it, and took the photos herself, describing the experience as "fun, but exhausting." Her second book, *Laleh's Table: Recipes for Your World From Around the Globe*, features dishes from 10 countries which were favorites of her catering

customers. And she's currently working on a book dedicated to desserts. Laleh says the best way to purchase the books is through her website (see box on page 3).

a book or share a book. You do not need to share a book in order to take one. But if you take a book or two from a little library, try to bring some to share to that same library, or another in your area, when you can.



In the last eight months, she's developed a line of healthful, high-protein, low-sugar snacks, and has a Class-B permit from the health department so she can cook them at home.

A bundle of energy, Laleh is also involved in community and charity work, especially around women's issues. She volunteers at PARS Equality Community Center teaching seniors different kinds of dancing.
